



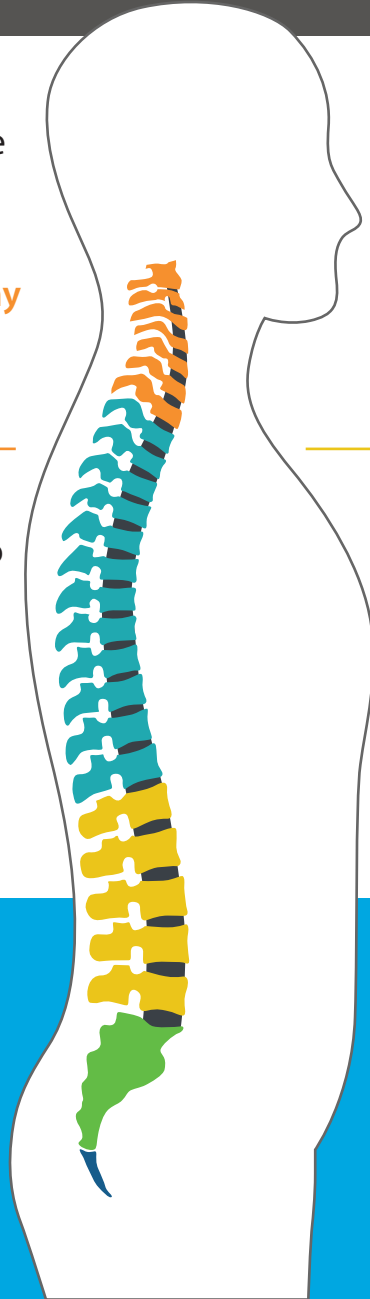
INJURY: A crane operator injures his neck; 3 months (35 visits) of physical therapy and no improvement to the injury. **Next step is SURGERY.**

A care coordination company coordinated the injured worker's physical therapy visits that resulted in no improvement to the injury. Therefore, **Anterior Cervical Spine Discectomy surgery is the next option.**

2

Carrier was referred to MTI and reached out to see if there are other options. MTI's physical medicine team explained that we have a **physical therapy clinic that specializes in spine treatment** in our network.

After a few weeks at the physical therapy clinic, the **injured worker experienced improvement.** Carrier was satisfied and authorized three months of visit.

4

Injured worker completed 3 months of therapy and was pain free, sleeping a full night again, and surgery was no longer a consideration. **The injured worker was able to return to work at his pre-morbid level and position.**
